Happy back to school!



Quebec's mineral industry has come a long way in recent decades, with improved resource management practices, a steadily shrinking environmental footprint and the development of an ESG* approach that is now a model in Canada.

O3 Mining is stepping up its efforts to develop its mining exploration projects responsibly. Several procedures and ways of doing things have been developed over the years in connection with the introduction of the EcoLogo certification, but also with the company's desire to implement best practices.

- Reforest and seed the explored territory

- **Use** biodegradable oils for heavy machinery

Finally, it details the training and inspection program to ensure best practices are put in place.
